I completed a Family Jam (participatory action-based research) Project to attain my master's degree. It was the only project presentation to receive a standing ovation from our local cohort of teachers, and was featured in a 2-page spread by the Nelson Star Newspaper in Nelson, B.C.

I wrote, choreographed and directed two full length musical screenplays for over two hundred children and received standing ovations for both from an audience of 500 at the Capitol Theatre in Nelson, B.C.
